## MORE ON THE EXCITING SPEAKER SCHEDULED FOR OUR JANUARY 28TH DINNER MEETING....

**Chris Goldblatt** is the founder and current CEO of the Fish Reef Project. This project is a Santa Barbara-based, non-profit which has the goal of creating an entire network of




marine life enhancement reefs throughout California. Each reef is to be about five acres in size and constructed of mixed-sized reef balls. In 18 months the reefs will sprout kelp forests and become home to amazing schools of bass, lobster, abalone and other species. The kelp


beds will also be instrumental in sucking tons of carbon out of the atmosphere while cleaning the water, while the reef balls will provide breeding and feeding grounds to fish of all sizes. The first reef will be in 40 feet of water off Malibu and the second off Santa Barbara. Eventually these structures will be found near every major harbor in California.

## FISH REPORT—Sherwood Kingsley goes on a 10-day, Larry Brown Charter...

Early on Oct. 31, **Phil Bell, Larry Brown, and Sherwood Kingsley** arrived at Point Loma for a ten-day trip on the

*Intrepid*. Larry had guaranteed us bountiful catches of tuna and wahoo. Our car was loaded with the usual fishing gear and a 100-quart cooler stuffed with SWAG for a fantastic raffle.

Once all our gear was on board, we were under way. The first order of business was the Captain's safety briefing and the dos and don'ts of the boat. Then Larry laid out his raffle merchandise. We could choose from T-shirts, hats, lures, coupons, and fishing equipment. The top prizes were a Phoenix Rod Blank, a custom wrapped rod, and an Avet reel. The raffle grossed \$1060, of which the Los Angeles Rod & Reel Foundation received a portion of the funds raised.

**Bill Cavanaugh**, the brother of **Pat Cavanaugh** (of *Pacific Dawn* fame) was our skipper. He spotted

Our first day fishing was a wahoo bingo! Lines went zipping through the water. The skinnies came over the rail in abundance. These critters bit on bait, surface Iron, and wahoo bombs. We also caught some yellowfin tuna and grouper. We left this spot and headed for the lower banks for the bigger tuna. The cows and super cows did not show up! The water was full of red crabs and the tunas we caught were full of red crabs and wanted no part of the sardines. We stayed at the lower banks for one day and then moved up the Baja Peninsula looking for more cooperative fish.

The last day of fishing produced a nice catch of fish. Most passengers caught near limits of tuna.

For me, I caught enough! At the dock anglers and tourists watched as the large fish were weighed for the jackpot honors. First place went to angler **Steve Coy** who had a 160-lb. tuna. **Phil Bell** took second place with a 66.4-lb. tuna and the third place went to angler **Dean Kibbler** with a 58-lb. wahoo.



# IGFA Reports on Pending Records

**Kathleen Rounds**, a San Diego Angler, may have a new women's line record catch for Pacific Halibut.

The fish was caught at Glacier Bay, Alaska. It weighed 228-lbs. and was taken on 30-lb. test. Club members please note: The line test (30 lbs.) to fish weight ratio (228) was 7 to 1.

A Pacific Barracuda weighing 11 lbs. was caught by angler **James Harless** off Costa Rica. He used 4-lb. line and this represents a pending record.

Extra Large tunas have been in the headlines lately. *Chum Line* reported in the October issue (pg 8) on a pending world record Yellowfin caught off Cabo San Lucas. The 427-lb. fish was caught by **Guy Yocum** and may represent a new all-tackle record.

Also noteworthy: An *Excel* trip returned in early December having boated a stunning 42 tuna over 200 lbs.

Stealing all the headlines was a fish that weighed 445 lbs. and represents the largest Yellowfin ever caught.

Angler **John Petruescu** used a skipjack for bait with a 12/0 Mustad Hook on 130-lb. line. (See photo at right.)

## OUR PRECIOUS FISHING ENVIRONMENT

In case you've not been following the media lately, you might not have noticed that the Marine Life Protection Act has now been concluded. The northern part of the state, per a report in a recent *LA Times* article, has now seen the final set of closures concluding a process started in 1999.

The state issues about 2 million fishing licenses annually and some of the commissioners have felt that setting aside specific areas will have a similar effect as has been experienced on terra firma.

The recreational fishing sector has differed and seen their protests ignored. There is still a lawsuit in the works, headed by the American Sportfishing Assn. (ASA) but challenging the science behind the DFG decisions promises to be an uphill fight.

The author reports that the Environmental Community has spent more than \$23 million on this project. Support came mainly from several well-known foundations: The Packard Foundation, The Moore Foundation, the Marisla Foundation and others picked

up the tab when the State found itself in a negative budget situation. About 20% of the coastline has now been restricted.

There are reports that 75% of our fisheries are overfished. One recent news item describes the widespread use of mislabeled food fish in restaurants and even sushi bars. (*LAT* 12/16) Some of our LARRC members attended a DFG Meeting Nov. 7th and reported back that the limit on bass had now been fixed at 5 and size reductions initiated. Additionally, bottom fishing for most species is on hold for a couple of months beginning of 2013. Thankfully, some new restrictions are being imposed on the "roundup" of forage species which are the basic necessity for the pelagics we like to catch.

## FOUNDATION YEAR END REPORT

The year of 2012 to date has been a very successful year for the Foundation. Thanks to the generosity of our members, friends of members and third-party donors we have received contributions of \$24,000, raised a net of \$8000 at our annual auction in February, received tributes of \$1000, and raised the additional sums of \$3,000 through our parking lot sales thanks to the efforts of **Steve Simon**, and \$900 at a special auction of a custom rod and reel at a general meeting. This totals about \$37,000 in total income.

Through the middle of December of this year the Foundation has, in addition to recurring expenses such as insurance and storage, spent \$12,000 on our Annual Kids Trip, \$4,250 on our two marine mentors programs, \$4000 for the Trout derby (with funding from the **Lou Berke family**) and \$17,000 in grants and donations including the grants to the Cabrillo Museum, Long Beach Aquarium, graduate and under-graduate students at Cal State Long Beach, the Hubbs Sea World white seabass program and the National Coalition for Marine Conservation (NCCM).

The Foundation has total expenses of \$41,000 and income of \$37,000 through the middle of December of 2012. We have already received additional income by way of contributions from members who made contributions to the Foundation along with their 2013 annual dues for which we are greatly appreciative.

We have funds set aside for next year's programs, projects and events and anticipate substantial additional income from the referenced contributions made along with payment of dues, contributions and donations from third parties and from the coming year's banquet and auction to be able to fund the projections of the Foundation for 2013. The Foundation will publish both the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss Statement for the year 2012 in the February *Chum Line*.

We greatly appreciate the support of our Club members and thank all of you for such ongoing support. The Foundation

received contributions from **Larry Brown** and participants on his charters totaling over \$2000.

Words cannot express the terrific job **Steve and Linda Simon** have done for the Foundation for several years. The Foundation would not have been as successful without their hard work and dedication. The Foundation gives a very big special thanks to Steve Simon as an outgoing trustee who will be replaced by **Randy Sharon** for a two year term. Special thanks are also in order for (1) **Joel and Tammy Steinman** for their hard work and donations. Tammy is in charge of the tribute program and Joel is in charge of the grants to the students at Cal State Long Beach; and (2) **John and Sue Ballotti** for their hard work in regard to providing source and application of funds reports to the trustees and their donations.

We plan to have Dr. Chris Lowe and a few of the students from Cal State Long Beach at the Awards Banquet and auction to be held on Sunday, February 24, 2013 at the Braemar Country Club. We are still in need of donations of items to be auctioned off both in the live and silent auction and will appreciate the efforts of members to help us in this regard.

Another date to be noted by the members is the Annual Lou Berke Trout Derby to be held at Hansen Dam on Friday, March 22- 2013. We plan to have at least 50 "special needs" children participate and at our meeting with principals of both schools we were told that this event will be the graduate event for both the 5th and 12th grade students so we want to do something very special to honor these graduating students. Volunteers will be needed since provide one-on-one help to each student.

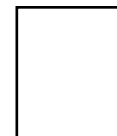
